

# PARTING THOUGHTS FROM YOUR NW REGION DIRECTOR

As I've been traveling a lot lately, I've had plenty of time to reflect on the past 3 years as NW Region Director. I remember that when I started my term, I thought that 3 years is a long time for a commitment such as being Region Director, but looking back now, that time has gone by much more quickly than I expected it would.

Being from Eugene, I believe that I'm entitled to my share of lame Duck jokes, so as I look forward (and back) I see about 3 more weeks that I have left to accomplish those region goals. And looking back, we have a lot to be proud of in the Northwest Region.

Some of the highlights of region accomplishments, that I think we can all be proud of over the past 3 years include:

- 1) Chartering a new chapter, the Big Sky chapter in Bozeman, Montana. From the time the goal was set to the actual chartering, the chapter population doubled. Since then, a student affiliate chapter has also been started at Montana State University. Kudos to our energetic NW Region Membership chair, Bob Simmons for having the vision and perseverance to keep the Big Sky chapter goal in front of us and seeing it to fruition.
- 2) Maintaining positive membership growth. Out of the 10 CSI Regions across the country, the NW Region is the only region to maintain positive growth over the past year. This in a period when membership nationwide has been declining. Once again, Bob Simmons' relentless efforts in membership have produced tangible and exceptional results. My challenge to all of you, bring a potential new member to your next chapter meeting, we need more new members!
- 3) Proactive participation at the Institute level of CSI. This year is no exception from years past; the NW Region continues to contribute talented people to the Institute's goals and objectives. Some of those include from our very own Willamette Valley Chapter, Loren Bery on Professional Development, Jim Robertson on Technical Committee and Joe Dworkin on Awards Committee; Bob Kenworthy from Mt. Rainier on Nominations, Bill Coody from Puget Sound on Certification, Cheri McNabb from Portland on Membership, and Martin Powell from Idaho and Marc Chavez from Puget Sound on UDS Task team. As you can see, the NW Region is well represented at the national level.
- 4) Reaching out to the Sheet Metal Workers through a presentation that we did in Tri Cities, Washington, which has resulted in a collaborative effort between SMACNA and CSI. The results have been increased CSI membership from the sheet metals workers and their adopting CSI's CDT certification as part of their apprenticeship curriculum, and in return, their expertise in putting on seminars related to specialty metals, sheet metal details and meeting / seminar space at their vocational facilities. Based on the success here in the NW, SMACNA is likely to encourage this alliance to continue on a national basis.
- 5) Successful implementation of what I like to call "the Urban Experiment" as related to how and where we hold our NW Region Conferences. I believe the first year of this was in Boise, with a brief break of one year at Port Ludlow, then consecutive urban conferences in Spokane, Portland and this year, in Salem. I remember when the decision was made to do this; there was a fair amount of reservation that people would want to attend such a conference in the city. Quite the contrary, attendance, educational programs and overall participation have been outstanding the last couple of years, and I have no reason to believe that this year's 2007 conference in Salem will be any different. Having been involved in meetings with the conference planning committees, starting in Spokane, and continuing through Portland and Salem, I can attest to all the hard work that each NW Region Planning committee has put forth. There is a tremendous amount of work that each committee does behind the scenes which most of us seldom see, we see only the finished product which have been very successful region conferences the past couple of years. I encourage each of you to say "thank you" to anyone that you know who has served on this very important region committee over the last couple of years.

While our NW Region ranks 8<sup>th</sup> of the 10 regions in terms of # of members by region, we rank a resounding #1 in total geographic area. With the addition of CSI's 146<sup>th</sup> chapter, the Big Sky chapter in Bozeman, Montana, our region now covers Montana, Idaho, Washington, Oregon and Alaska. That is some serious real estate! If you started at the east end of Montana and flew to the west end of Alaska, you could certainly chalk up some significant frequent flyer miles! For the current decade, our own Willamette Valley has put forth an Institute President, as well as 3 Institute Vice Presidents, how's that for involvement and participation by a small to mid sized chapter? Portland & Puget Sound Chapters are the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> largest chapters in CSI, and both have shown impressive growth over the past year.

Encouraged by the success of the Big Sky chapter, our region membership brain trust is currently exploring other options where group affiliates might be established, which could ultimately culminate in the formation of future chapters.

These are exciting times for CSI. The governance issue is certainly not dead; it will be re-visited and likely put before the voting membership again in the near future, following extensive member involvement in the feedback process. Nearly 61% of those that voted this past March thought a governance change was a good idea. I encourage all of you to pay attention to this issue, as you will have the opportunity to say what's on your mind, and what's important to you via forums and at the Annual Meeting in Baltimore. If and when a governance change is passed, it's not the cure all for CSI, only one important step among several that should move CSI back to the forefront of industry associations that its members want to and need to belong to. The branding initiative will continue moving forward also, with the ultimate goal to share one of the best kept secrets in the industry, telling people who CSI is and what we're all about. I was recently at a CSI conference, amongst a group of my colleagues when someone sitting nearby called me over and asked me which show I'm affiliated with. Looking down at my shirt, I had to smile and tell him we're with "the other CSI", another classic case of misdirected name recognition. I'm confident that we will get there and get the message out.

I think Walt Marlowe, our new Executive Director is firmly committed to helping identify the needs of our industry, and figuring out how CSI can position to respond to the industry needs while putting CSI at the forefront of industry associations that more members will want to belong to.

While I am sad to be "retiring" as NW Region Director, I confidently leave you in the able hands of Anne Whitacre and Bob Simmons, in whom I have every confidence that the NW Region will be well represented and taken care of. I am excited to be turning my focus in a new direction as Industry Vice President, and being a part of moving CSI forward to new heights and territory that we haven't yet explored.

I hope to see many of you at the CSI Show and Convention in Baltimore, June 20-22 and at the NW Region Conference in Salem, Oregon August 23-26, 2007. I also encourage you to get actively involved, whether it is at the chapter, region or institute level. Don't be a bystander, watching from the sidelines. Be an active participant, in the middle of the action. Be able to look back at the end of the day and say, "I was part of something important, and proud of what we accomplished."

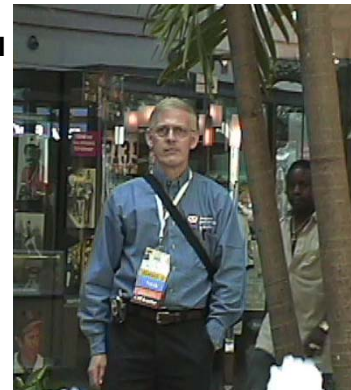
